

FCC Regulatory Process

"Everyone you will ever meet knows something you don't."

Decisions that affect access to many technologies and services are made at the Federal Communications Commission

- Not unilateral decisions
- Stakeholder input sought via a public comment process
- Submitted comments are considered in developing the rule

The process can be initiated by:

- Congressional statute (broad or specific)
- The Commission identifying a problem that needs addressing
- You (i.e., Petition for rulemaking)

Importance of Participation


Apply inclusive principles early and throughout the rulemaking process.

Reactive to proactive policy requires:

- Anticipation of the outcomes of new tech
- Balanced stakeholder input


Commenters represent industry, all stakeholders and government entities.



- Initial
- Reply
- Ex Parte

Federal Register

- Comment Deadlines
- Effective dates
- Compliance deadlines



Writing to Get Cited

Preparation

- Refer to specific sections of the rulemaking
- Respond to specific questions in the rulemaking

Drafting response

- Include support for your recommendations
- Include examples to illustrate your points
- If opposing, provide an alternative solution

Concluding discussion

Discuss who benefits and how from your recommendations

Example

Paragraph 70: We seek comment on how to best ensure that community-based alerting exercises address the accessibility needs of individuals with limited English proficiency and individuals with disabilities...and on how to better prepare such communities for emergencies through PSAs.

Our 2015 WEA Survey collected data on WEA awareness. A majority of all respondents (60%) had heard of WEA prior to the survey. In the 2013-2014 WEA survey data, 59% of all respondents had heard of WEA. This indicates that despite increased WEA-capable phone penetration, WEA awareness levels have remained flat. Respondents without a disability were twice as likely to report having heard of WEA (69%) than those respondents with disability (53%) (p<0.01)...

These data suggest that there is significant room for growth regarding educating people with disabilities on the availability of WEA. Due to the differing awareness levels based on disability category, we support targeted outreach, as well as ensuring that outreach materials and methods are appropriate and accessible to the target population.
